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



MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF NATIONAL COMMITTEE FOR SELECTION OF SCHOOLS FOR NATIONAL LEVEL AWARDS UNDER SWACHH VIDYALAYA PURASKAR (S.V.P.) 2017-2018.

The meeting of National Level Committee for selection of schools for National level Awards under Swachh Vidyalaya Puraskar 2017-18 was held under the Chairpersonship of Ms. Rina Ray, Secretary, Department of School Education & Literacy, Ministry of Human Resource Development on 20th August, 2018 at 10.30 am in Conference Hall, Room No. 112-C, Shastri Bhawan, New Delhi. List of participants in the meeting is at **Annexure-I**.

2. The Secretary, Department of School Education & Literacy welcomed the Members of the Committee, and requested JS(SE.1) to put forward agenda items for consideration of the Committee.
3. Shri Maneesh Garg, JS (SE.1) gave an overview on the Swachh Vidyalaya Puraskar 2017-2018. He informed the Committee that the Swachh Vidyalaya Puraskar 2017-2018 was open to Government, Government aided and Private schools. There is no specific quota for any of three categories of schools. All States/ UTs have participated in SVP 2017-2018. While over 6 lakh schools registered for the awards, 5,33,855 schools in the country have submitted completed online applications for SVP 2017-2018. UNICEF has selected 'Network for Engineering and Economics Research and Management (NEERMAN) for conducting the third party field validation survey of 727 shortlisted State/UT level schools for National level SVP 2017-2018. During SVP 2016-2017, a total of 172 schools including 14 five star schools and 158 four star (as an one-time exception) schools were awarded National level awards.
4. JS (SE.1) also informed the Committee that as per the guidelines for SVP, 2017-18, a maximum of 200 schools with bifurcation of 100 schools each at elementary and secondary level can be awarded at the National level (30 urban and 70 rural). The National Level Award is open only to 5 star rated schools. As per the guidelines, a maximum of top 100 schools having the maximum score with five star ratings each at elementary and secondary levels are to be given an award of Rs. 50,000/- as additional School Grant to be utilized as per the School Grant guidelines for improving sanitation and hygiene at the National level along with a Certificate. Also, 3 best performing States can be recognized and awarded with a Certificate of Recognition based on the scores secured by their nominated schools qualified for National level awards. In addition, Certificates of Recognition may be awarded to best participating districts (a total of 10) based on their participation in National level awards.
5. With the permission of Chair, NEERMAN made a power point presentation on results of field validation survey of schools for National level awards for SVP 2017-18. The Field Validation Survey of Schools indicated that there were 727 schools in the zone of consideration for the national level award, out

of which 637 are Government Schools and 90 are Private Schools. NEERMAN had assessed 168 schools in 5-star rating and 385 in 4-star rating out of 727 nominated schools as per their evaluation report. NEERMAN has used some tools during field validation i.e. NEERMAN app and ASCI app, with additional questions for validation.

6. UNICEF based on the physical verification/ evaluation by NEERMAN of 727 shortlisted State/UT level schools had given a list of 168 schools in 5-star rating. The National level Committee headed by Secretary (SE&L) for selection of final awardees at National level for SVP 2017-18 advised the Department and UNICEF to jointly see the available videos and photographs of the schools in 5-star and 4-star rating. Accordingly, a team from DSEL, UNICEF and TSG viewed the videos/photographs as well as score chart as per the check list in the guidelines based on which NEERMAN had given sub-category-wise scores to the shortlisted schools. On perusal of the videos/photographs and relevant documents; and detailed deliberation a list of 171 schools were found conforming to 5-star rating, and in this process new evaluation score in % were given to some schools and also, 6 schools rated as 5-star by NEERMAN were downgraded to 4-star and 9 schools in 4-star rating upgraded to 5-star rating.

7. On submitting the list of 171 schools, in order to ensure that the schools selected for national level awards are truly deserving, Secretary (SE&L) directed to again review these schools through a team comprising of officers of MHRD, UNICEF and TSG; and shortlist and finalize a list of schools which are suitable for National level awards. Accordingly, a meeting was held under the Chairpersonship of Secretary (SE&L) on 30.8.2018 from 2:30 PM in Conference Hall, Room No. 112-C, Shastri Bhawan. During the meeting videos/photographs of all 171 schools were viewed again on 30.8.2018 till 10:00 PM. Officials from UNICEF and TSG were also present. After perusal, analysis and review a list of 52 schools were drawn for recommending the National awards. List of 52 schools recommended for the National awards under SVP 2017-18 is at **Annexure-II**.

8. Details of the recommended schools, area, management and level-wise are as under:

10. From the above table 2 it is obvious that Puducherry, Tamil Nadu, Gujarat and Andhra Pradesh are the top States and they are recommended for being awarded with Certificate of Recognition. Education Secretary of these States/UT may receive award in this category.

11. The SVP guidelines also prescribe awarding to the best participating districts (total 10). Accordingly, following 9 districts with maximum number of schools qualified for National awards may be given Certificate of Recognition in the prize ceremony for National awards, SVP 2017-18.

They are recommended for giving Certificate of Recognition in the prize ceremony for National level award. Best districts awards may be given to District Magistrate/District Collector/Deputy Commissioner.

12. Other decisions taken by the National Committee are as under:

(i) The Committee has decided to give Rs. 50,000/- each to the selected schools either from Government/Government aided or Private management as an additional school grant.

(ii) The Committee relaxed the provision for 100% physical verification of the nominated schools in case of only 1 school in Lakshadweep which was evaluated by the NEERMAN based on audio and video inputs from the school because the evaluation team could not access it due to inclement weather and other reasons.

(iii) It was decided to invite Principal/Head teacher/Incharge of the selected schools to receive the award in school category. One student from each selected school preferably Swachhata Monitor as nominated by the school may accompany Principal/Head teacher/Incharge to receive the National award.

(iv) The arrangements for stay (boarding, lodging and local transport at Delhi) of teachers and students receiving National awards will be made by Ed.CIL.

(v) Professional photography/ videography of selected schools for curtain raiser video and exhibition to be showcased during the prize ceremony. The videos should have the testimonials of students especially girl students and should be in same format.

(vi) UNICEF to make arrangements for the National award ceremony scheduled on 18th September, 2018 at Dr. Ambedkar International Centre, New Delhi, and bear expenditure relating to this. An exhibition on Swachh Vidyalaya Puraskar covering the best 100 photographs of schools, models of toilets, demo of app, videos of best schools etc. to be also arranged by UNICEF.

13. The prize money for the 52 selected schools with 24 elementary and 28 secondary/higher secondary schools @ Rs. 50,000/- each will be met from Samagra Shiksha heads for elementary and secondary budget 2018-19 respectively and will be released by Ed.CIL directly to the bank account of the selected schools as done last year through RTGS and an advice in the envelop will be given to award winning schools along with a Certificate.

14. The Committee decided to review the existing guidelines for Swachh Vidyalaya Puraskar 2018-19 including rating system i.e. 1 to 5-star and suggested for separate categorization of standalone primary and upper primary schools for the purpose of awards under SVP 2018-19 and focus on toilets in schools and hand washing while selection of schools for the awards.

15. The Committee also desired that the Department should facilitate schools to have good videos for best practices in schools for justification for the nominated schools for National awards. The Committee also suggested that State may provide some sustainable incentivisation and consistency in Swachhata for the awardees schools. The Committee opined that in view of vacations, the Award function may be held in November-December 2019 for SVP 2018-19 and a schedule may be prepared accordingly.

16. The Committee desired that the evaluation agency may make a comparison of schools which were given National awards in SVP 2016-17 and are recommended for National awards SVP 2017-18 in terms of their performance, whether increasing or decreasing. The Committee also asked the evaluation team of NEERMAN to compile data State/UT-wise for all nominated schools, with their ratings and ranks. They may prepare State/UT-wise data analytics for the final 52 selected schools, and also for all 727 nominated schools.

The meeting ended with thanks to the chair.

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
